

## PRESS RELEASE, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: IMPACT OF COVID-19

Due to the increasing rates of COVID-19 cases in our community, we are encouraging all residents to shelter in place as much as possible and to avoid all non-essential travel.

As of 12/15/2020 there have been a reported total of 309 positive cases in Hudspeth County of which 75 are active cases and these figures are increasing by the day. We have recognized that 35 of these are in Horizon City and we have manually removed these from county tracking. We would like to reiterate the impact that the recent surge in Corona Virus cases has had on the Texas Department of Health Region 9/10 of El Paso. We are only able to report cases as they are reported to us.

We are reporting the latest numbers of Corona Virus cases in our community. The Texas Department of Health Region 9/10 of El paso sent a Public service Answering Points (PSAP) report on, which reports 41 new active cases, with 19 in Fort Hancock, 19 in Sierra Blanca and 3 in Dell City/Salt Flat, and 3 confirmed county resident fatalities and 3 suspected with final results pending.

We are currently operating under Governor Abbot's Executive Order GA-32, as a result, all restaurants, retail stores, office buildings, manufacturing facilities, gyms and exercise facilities and classes, museums, and libraries in all counties in Trauma Service J are required to return to maximum 50% percent occupancy levels. IF YOU RESIDE WITH A FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS ISOLATED IN YOUR HOME YOU MUST QUARANTINE. FAILURE TO DO SO CONSIDERED CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR, CLASS A MISDEMEAN TO WIT: DEADLY CONDUCT - TEXAS PENAL CODE 22.05 (a)(e)

Deadly Conduct is a crime defined in the Texas Penal Code under Chapter 22.05. This crime is committed when one recklessly engages in conduct that places another person in imminent danger of serious bodily injury.

PLEASE TAKE THIS VIRUS SERIOUSLY, PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS, WEAR A MASK, WASH YOUR IIANDS AND KEEP 6FT DISTANCE.
